

Traffic network Northzeeland has set up a contact group with principals, directors, etc. from the youth educational institutions





Experience and status of the collaboration

Big difference in time available between the institutions:

- More time available at the technical schools, trade schools and Social and Healthcare schools
- Less time available for the upper secondary educations

Police district offers visits:

- At the institution's student assemblys (10-minute pep talk)
- After a previous Traffic Safety Live visit performed by the council for safe traffic (RFST)
- Attendance with a Mobile police station in the school yard after a Traffic Safe Live visit

Status of the collaboration:

- Contact groups meetings every six months
- RFST participates in the meetings
- 18 RFST-Live visits since approx.
 1/9-22
- 1 police visit to a technical school
- The activity opportunities are shared between the institutions.
- Police presentation at annual workshop for all SUN groups
